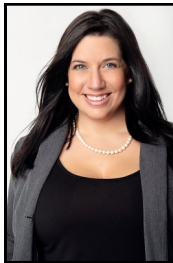


BOARD OF DIRECTORS & LEADERSHIP

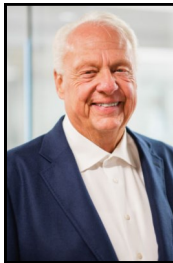
Co-President, Amy Tallent
